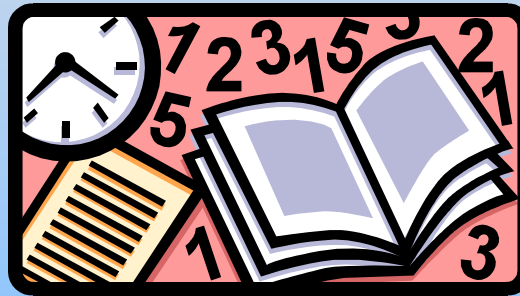

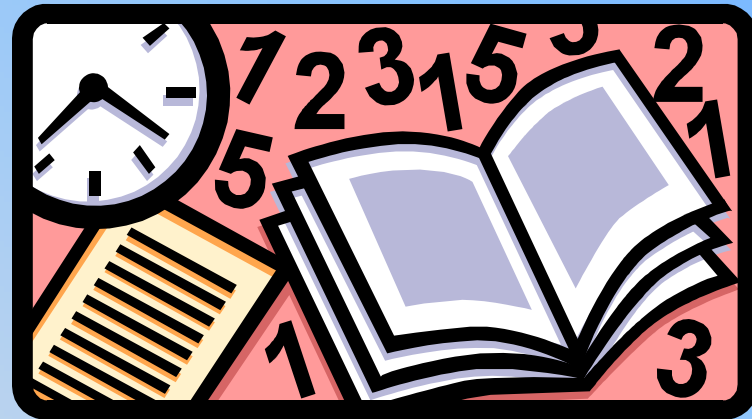
Purpose of Homework

- Additional Learning Time
- Strengthen Study and Organizational Skills
- Reinforces Skills
- Keeps Parents Informed



Purpose of Homework

- Self Esteem
- Time Management Skills
- Independence
- Responsibility
- Accomplishment



Key Research Findings

Impact of homework on achievement increases as students move through the grades. At the high school level for every 30 minutes of homework completed daily a student's GPA can increase up to half a point.



Key Research Findings

Homework assignments provide the time and experience students need to develop habits that support learning and help them cope with mistakes and difficulty.

Key Research Findings

Mastery requires focused practice over days or weeks. After only 4 practice sessions students reach a halfway point to mastery. It takes more than 24 more practice sessions before students reach 80 percent mastery. This practice must occur over a span of days or weeks and cannot be rushed!

Key Research Findings

Studies indicate that it takes longer to complete homework at night and students may benefit by completing homework in the daylight hours.



Homework Policy

Students shouldn't spend more than 90 minutes per night on homework and should be as follows:

- 5 minutes looking for the assignment
- 11 minutes calling a friend for the assignment
- 23 minutes explaining how the teacher is mean
- 8 minutes in the bathroom

Homework Policy

- 10 minutes getting a snack
- 7 minutes checking the TV guide
- 6 minutes telling parents that the teacher never explained the assignment
- 10 minutes sitting at the kitchen table waiting for Mom or Dad to do the assignment

The Real Homework Policy

Suggested Time Allotments:

- Grades 1-2: 15-20 minutes
- Grades 3-4: 30-45 minutes
- Grades 5-6: 45-60 minutes
- Grades 7-12: 75-120 minutes

General Strategies

SPACE

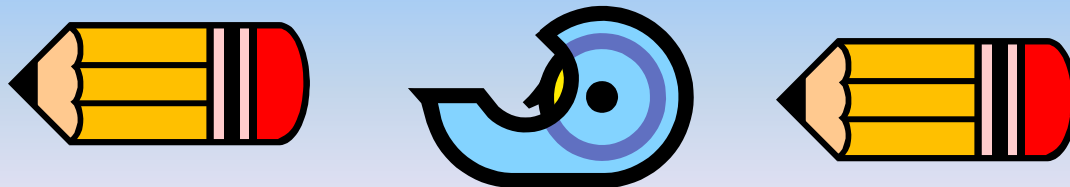
Make sure your child has a quiet, well lit place to do homework.



General Strategies

MATERIALS

Have all the necessary materials all set.
Paper, pencils, erasers, pens, reference
books and material for special projects.



General Strategies

TIME MANAGEMENT

Establish a set time each day for doing homework.

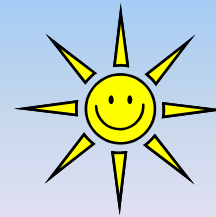
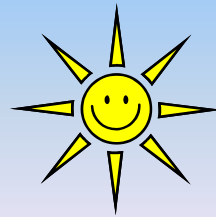


General Strategies

ATTITUDE

Tell your child how important school is.

The attitude you express about homework will be the attitude your child acquires.



General Strategies

SUPPORT

When your child asks for help, provide guidance, not answers.



General Strategies

MODEL

Show your child that the skills they are learning are related to things you do as an adult. If your child is reading, do the same. If your child is doing math, balance your checkbook.

General Strategies

INVOLVEMENT

Stay informed and involved in what your child needs to do.



General Strategies

PRAISE



Use praise on a daily basis. When your child has been successful completing homework and is working hard, celebrate that success with a special event.

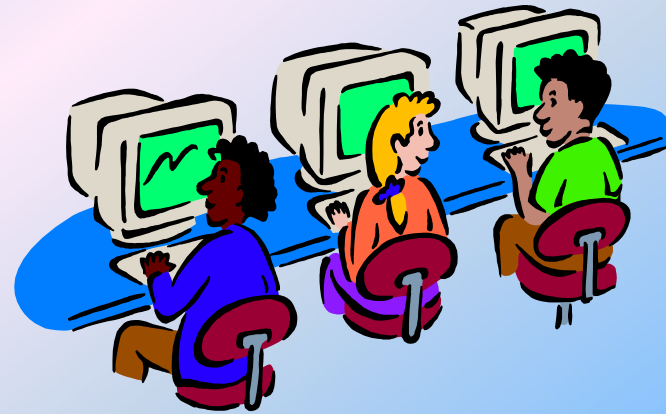
Specific Strategies

- Keep a list of homework buddies

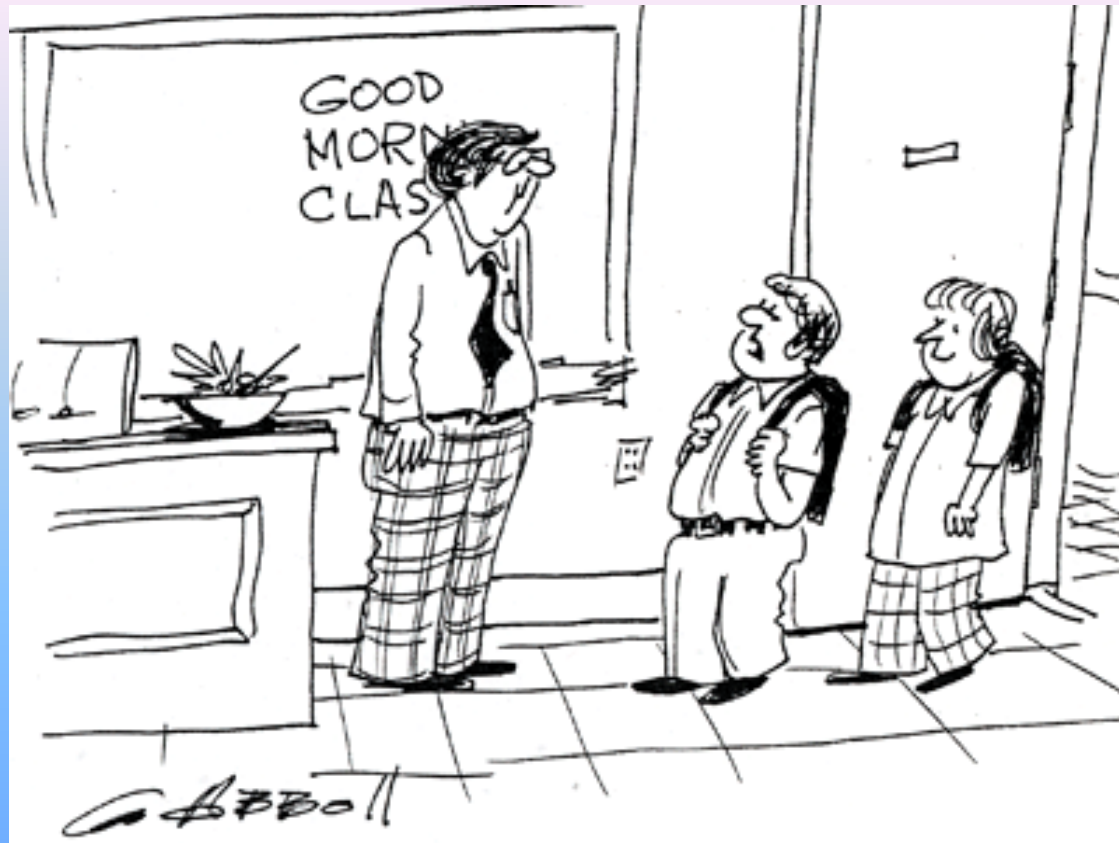


Specific Strategies
