- Use technology responsibly to enhance inquiry, research, and communication

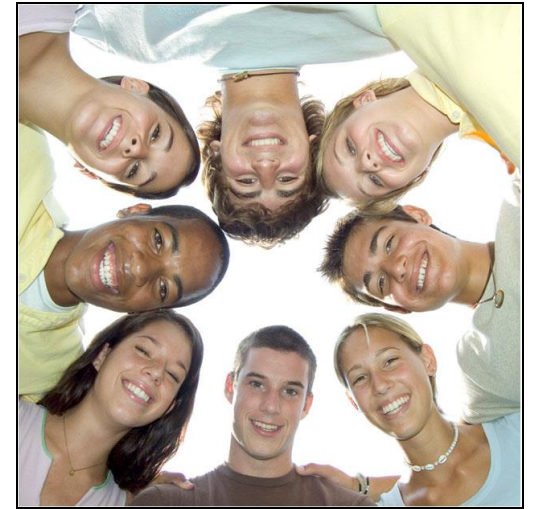
Civic and Social Expectations:
